We have seen, like most schools in the country, an increase in the number of students who vape. This has also been reported in the media. Interestingly, over the years, schools have seen a significant reduction in the number of young people smoking. But we are seeing an upsurge in vaping. When caught, vaping students are dealt with through our discipline system, including contacting parents and caregivers.
